Safe Disposal

- ✓ Never dump waste on the ground
- ✓ Never pour waste down your drains

Safe Use

- ✓ Follow the label directions exactly
- ✓ Never mix products unless recommended
- ✓ Wear protective gear as directed
- ✓ Properly ventilate work areas

Safe Transportation

- ✓ Secure containers upright in a box
- ✓ Place leaking containers inside another sealed container

hope this message finds you well. As the Chairman of Rockland Green, I am immensely proud to share that in 2024, an impressive 23,867 residents utilized the Household Hazardous Waste Facility (HHW). Demonstrating a strong commitment to environmental stewardship and responsible waste management.

Residents can bring a variety of items to our facility, including paints and varnishes, pesticides, household cleaners, batteries, all types of light bulbs, motor oil and antifreeze, electronics, mercury-containing devices, aerosol cans (to prevent fires) and much more.

It is very important to note the dangers of not properly disposing of items such as e-batteries. When e-batteries are not brought to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility, they pose significant risks, including fires, explosions, and harmful chemical leaks. These dangers can threaten our homes, health, and the environment. By ensuring that e-batteries are disposed of safely, we can prevent potential hazards and maintain a safer community for everyone.

In recent years, there has been a significant trend towards the growth of personal electronic devices. Many of us now rely on a single handheld device to perform multiple functions that were previously spread across various larger devices. This shift towards multifunctional handheld devices has simplified our lives and also decreased the amount of electronic waste. Therefore, it is crucial to ensure that these older devices, along with their components such as e-batteries, are disposed of properly to prevent potential hazards.

Additionally, I am pleased to highlight that the Paint Care Law saved Rockland residents over \$66,000 in 2024. This initiative has significantly reduced the cost of paint disposal, further supporting our mission to promote responsible waste management and sustainability.

To make it even more convenient for you, we host weekend drop-off events throughout the year. These events are designed to provide you with the flexibility to dispose of hazardous materials at a time that suits your busy schedule. We understand that weekdays can be hectic, so these weekend events offer an additional opportunity to keep our community safe and clean.



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

The Household Hazardous Waste Facility (HHW) is a drop-off collection facility that accepts household hazardous waste materials from county residents and small businesses that qualify for CESQG status. This service is for Rockland County Residents only.

The Household Hazardous Waste Facility is open for weekday drop-off service every Monday through Friday (except holidays) and on select weekends from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at 35 Firemens Memorial Drive, Pomona HHW Hotline: (845) 364-2444

For your convenience and safety, please remain in your car at all times. Your car will be unloaded by trained staff.

DROP-OFF SCHEDULE: 8:00 A.M. TO 1:00 P.M. (EXCEPT FOR SELECT HOLIDAYS)

SHARPS DISPOSAL: Sharps are needles, syringes, and lancets used by residents for self-medication. These items are not accepted at the HHW Facility. For information on SHARPS disposal, call (845) 364-2175 or visit rocklandgreen.com/special-programs/resident-events/sharps/.



Small businesses, institutions, and nonprofits in Rockland County that gualify for CESQG status may also deliver household hazardous waste for a fee. This fee is waived for Rockland municipalities and schools. Call (845) 364-8962 to schedule an appointment.





ELECTRONIC WASTE

NYS BANS THE DISPOSAL OF ELECTRONIC WASTE in landfills and bans waste haulers from collecting it. It is the consumer's responsibility to dispose of these materials properly. Waste electronics can be brought to participating retailers for recycling as well as the HHW Facility.

The program is called The Manufacturer's Take-Back Program. For more information, please check out the DEC's list of retailers on their website at **dec.ny.gov**. Have you received this sticker on your e-waste? Bring your e-waste back to participating retailers for recycling or to the HHW Facility for recycling.



BATTERIES

BATTERY DISPOSAL: Batteries of any kind should not be placed in the household garbage or recycling bins, especially if they are lithium-ion. Place non-conductive tape over the battery connections (terminals) and place them in a plastic or cardboard container. Batteries can be brought to participating retailers as well as the HHW Facility for recycling.

SHARPS

CONDITIONALLY EXEMPT SMALL QUANTITY GENERATORS

PHARMACEUTICAL DISPOSAL

DO NOT FLUSH pharmaceuticals down the toilet or dispose of them in the garbage. They contaminate our water supply and environment.

NON-CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE MEDICATION can be brought to the HHW Facility during the 10 weekend drop-off events.

***CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE**

MEDICATIONS can be brought to most local police departments and the Rockland County Sheriff's Office. Contact your local law enforcement for more information. Controlled substances can only be accepted during the 10 scheduled weekend events during the calendar year.
